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How to correctly fill out a score sheet

General tips:

- ✓ SLOW DOWN and double-check what you write on the score sheet. If you write the score wrong and the fencers all sign, they will suffer for your mistake as the WRONG SCORE WILL STAND.
- ✓ Use PENCIL and not pen in case corrections need to be made.
- ✓ Keep the score sheet under your CONTROL at all times so there can be no question of its accuracy. Don't let parents or coaches wander off with it.
- ✓ Write LARGE and CLEAR.

Number references:

1. Find out if you are sharing the pool. If you are, stay at the strip even when you aren't refereeing.
2. A victory where five (5) touches have been scored can be written as simply "V".
3. A victory that ends with less than five (5) touches such as in the case of a bout that has gone to time should be written reflecting the final number of touches scored (ie. "V4"). Write these in **bold** for the bout committee.
4. In the event that a fencer has won a tied bout because they were awarded priority, the score is written to reflect only touches scored (ie. "V4 - 4"). *Don't award touches that were not actually scored.* Just record the victory and write a comment on it if possible (see point 7).
5. Make sure all fencers sign the score sheet. The best way to do this is to get signatures immediately after each athlete fences their last bout – not after the last bout of the pool.
6. Write down which fencer committed the offense IMMEDIATELY after it happened (stop the bout to record every penalty), what group (1st, 2nd, 3rd, etc.), and what it was for (failed weapon, turning, lack of inspection stamp). **A penalty that is not written down technically never happened and can be challenged.**
7. If a bout has a tied score at the end of time and goes into a priority overtime minute make sure to write down who has won priority before starting that last minute of fencing. Remember...just like penalty cards, *if it's not written down it never happened.*
8. If a 3rd group penalty is given either to a coach or athlete these are to be written down immediately and make sure the bout committee is aware of any 3rd group cards. They follow the offender through the remainder of the event.
9. Write your name in BLOCK LETTERS. Then sign. This ensures you get credit for the pool.
10. Write **numbers** on the score sheet rather than slashes.
11. Make sure to indicate what the score is in each period of a direct elimination match.
12. Again write down what group any penalties given were in, and what they were for.
13. As video replays are used and lost because the referees original call stands, they are to be scratched off.
14. If a fencer refuses to sign they agree to the score by assent and **cannot** appeal it.
